

**Indian Creek School District #425
Elementary School Improvement Goals
2007-08**

Indian Creek School District #425 has had an established multi-year goal of having 30% of its students exceed state learning standards while having no less than 90% of the students meeting or exceeding state standards. In order to help the district work toward this goal, the faculty and administration of Indian Creek Elementary Schools will together focus on the following educational priorities throughout this school year.

1. We will use modern technology (in the form of computerized NWEA/MAP testing) to develop a system of more frequent standardized data collection in an effort to:
 - ❖ receive timely feedback about student performance levels in reading, language usage, and math.
 - ❖ develop individualized goals for students performing outside of grade-level parameters at *both* the high and low levels.
 - ❖ carefully monitor the *rate* of growth and readily respond with appropriate interventions.
2. Administration will work in a concerted effort to facilitate faculty competence and confidence in accessing MAP testing data and using it to guide instructional practices.

2008-09 Elementary SIP Extension

1. The faculty and administration of SES and WES will form and implement building-level whole faculty study groups devoted to the following faculty-prioritized goal areas:
 - ✚ Academic- Focus on the growth of students who meet and/or exceed standards
 - ✚ Behavioral- Examine current social/emotional programs (including school-wide skills and services)
2. As part of the State of Illinois RtI (Response to Intervention) mandate, both buildings will work together (through building and district-level committees, including parent/community stakeholders) to insure collaborative planning for RtI procedures and practices at the elementary level.
